Who is UniFest for?

UniFest is for students in Year 10 at state-funded secondary schools in the West Midlands.

UniFest aims to help young people from backgrounds and communities that are less likely to be considering university as an option. To apply for a place you will need the support of your school and the consent of your parents or carers, and you should be able to answer "Yes" to at least one of the following*

- My parents or carers did not go to university
- I receive Free School Meals
- I have a disability or learning difficulty
- I am in the care of my local authority
- I am a young carer.

WHAT IS UNIFEST?

UniFest Summer Schools take place at 5 universities across the West Midlands.

UniFest gives you the chance to spend time exploring university life, meeting students and staff, making friends and having an action packed, fun experience. UniFest 2017 will give you a chance to develop your

study skills, build your confidence and decide if university is the right option for you.

What will I do?

That depends on which UniFest event you choose. Some explore university life and study in general, and others focus on certain career or study options.

What's the catch?

There is no catch. UniFest is funded by universities **and is totally free of charge.** Meals, accommodation, activities and travel costs are all paid for (although you may want to bring a little pocket money with you). The universities will help you plan how to get to and from events.

How do I get involved?

To apply you must have the support of your school, as you will attend during term time. You and your parents or carers will need to complete an application form, giving us information about you, your career interests and your parents' or carers' education and work.

What happens if there are more applicants than places?

UniFest is very popular, and there are often more applicants than places. We ask for information about your family background and advise you to choose several events so that we can offer places as fairly as possible. > 1 Apply (January to March 2017)

Talk to your parents / carers, and show them this Directory. They will need to agree to your application, and give us information about their education and work background (see "Who is UniFest for?").

Think about your interests and future plans. Look at the events in this Directory and the subject areas they cover. If you have a clear idea of the career you want to follow a specialist event might be right for you. If you don't have a specific career in mind yet, a more general event will give you the chance to try different subject areas. Check out the universities' websites and ask your teachers about it. Do they think going to UniFest will help you? Perhaps they will know some older students in your school who went to UniFest last year and could tell you more about it? Either way, you will need your school to support your application, so the sooner you ask the better!

Apply. After you and your parents or carers have filled in your application, pass it to your teacher to complete it and send it off. Don't forget to make a note of dates of your selected events, and keep them free!

We will send you a postcard confirming that we have received your application, and contact you if there is any information missing or if you have any additional support needs.

2 Result (April 2017)

If you are offered a place you will receive a letter in April. This will tell you which of your choices you are going to, and give you the contact details of the university staff planning your visit. Make sure you tell your parents/carers and your teacher straight away so that they do not plan anything that clashes with your UniFest experience! If your application is not successful we will write to you with the reasons and give you a telephone number you can ring for more feedback.






3 Get Ready (April to June 2017)

What will I do?

Are you interested in finding out more about Science, Technology, Engineering or Maths (STEM) related subjects at University? If yes, then this is the Summer School for you!

You will have the opportunity to experience fun and interactive sessions in STEM, taught by real University lecturers. There will be an exciting and inspirational mix of practical sessions, lectures and

What will I learn?



How will I get there?



What will I do?

What is happening in the brain when someone decides to commit a crime?

What exactly is forensic science?

How does a 'real' court differ from what we see on TV, and how do they operate?

This summer school will answer the above questions and more. You will have the chance to work with experts from across the justice sector, exploring criminological disciplines like psychology, forensic science, and law. You will investigate what drives people to commit a crime, how forensics can lead to a suspect, and how the courts decide who is innocent and who is guilty. You will have the chance to try your hand at academic study – to find out what studying for a degree is really like, and there will be socials – so you can relax with your course-mates at the end of a busy day.

FREGUENTLY ASKEDQUESTIONS

PARENTS/CARERS

WHY SHOULD MY CHILD ATTEND?

UniFest gives your child a great chance to find out what university is all about, so that they can make the right decisions about their future. The experience is exciting, fun and really motivates young people to do their best at school.

WILL MY CHILD BE SAFE?

YES - UniFest universities have a duty of care towards young people that starts from the moment they are handed over to us. Your host university will give you details of hand-over points and travel support arrangements at the start and end of each event. It is important you read and understand this information, so that we are working together to keep everyone safe, especially at the start and end of events.

All UniFest activities are risk assessed and supervised by qualified staff and trained students, all of whom are checked by the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS...the new name for CRB). Your child will stay in halls of residence with DBS approved staff and students staying overnight to supervise things.

BEHAVIOUR

The universities expect everyone to behave responsibly and follow instructions. All students must sign a Code of Conduct that makes it very clear that if they break the Code of Conduct they may be sent home. If there are problems you will be kept informed throughout.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

UniFest is FREE. If you have to pay for travel the university will send you details of how to claim money back.

WHY DO YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT MY EDUCATION AND WORK BACKGROUND?

Young people from families where no one has been to university are much less likely to go into higher education and the professions. We need to find out about your background so we can offer places to young people who need extra support to decide if university is right for them.

HOW WILL YOU PROTECT OUR PERSONAL DATA?

To take part in UniFest we need information about you and your child to share the data with Aimhigher universities so they can run the programme. The application form and further forms you will be sent if you are offered a place are important, and we will not be able to accommodate anyone who does not complete them in full and return them on time. The application form will also ask your permission to use the data you provide to help us see how young people attending UniFest get on in their exams and if they apply for university. Any information we publish will not make reference to you or your child individually. Full details are on the application form.

WHAT IF MY CHILD BECOMES ILL?

We will contact you, using the details you have provided on the application/consent form. It is important that you tell us if these change before the event.

HOW CAN I CONTACT MY CHILD?

You will be given emergency contact details for the university in the run up to the event. Young people can take mobile phones but do so at their own risk.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD NEED TO BRING?

The universities will give you details of the type and amount of clothing and other personal belongings they will need.

YOUNG PEOPLE

WILL I HAVE TO DO REAL WORK?

UniFest is your chance to see what student life and study is all about... so YES you will be expected to take part in all planned sessions, but the universities will make it exciting and interesting.

WILL I BE WITH MY FRIENDS?

Often a few friends from the same school go to the same event, but a big part of UniFest is meeting new people and making new friends... DON'T WORRY! University staff and students will help break the ice, and most people end up with lots of new friends.

WHAT SORT OF CLOTHES SHOULD I WEAR?

Casual clothes are appropriate most of the time. You may want to take sportswear and something a little smarter for evening activities. If you need any special clothing your university will let you know before the event.

WHERE AND WHAT WILL I EAT?

All your meals will be provided, and we will cater for any special dietary needs. Details of the arrangements for Ramadan can be found on the event listings pages.

WILL I NEED TO BRING ANY MONEY?

You can bring a small amount of money for snacks/drinks but you will be responsible for it at all times.

SCHOOL STAFF

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST MY SCHOOL?

UniFest is free of charge.

HOW DOES ATTENDING HELP YOUNG PEOPLE?

The Sutton Trust has evaluated summer schools as a high impact intervention as part of their Pupil Premium toolkit. Attending can raise aspirations, improve attainment and contribute to your duty to provide impartial careers education and guidance.

WHICH LEARNERS SHOULD APPLY?

Young people whose parents / carers do not have graduate-level qualifications, those with disabilities and / or learning difficulties and those in or leaving the care system will be given high priority. Applications from young people receiving Free-School Meals during the last 6 years will be looked upon favourably. We also welcome applications from young carers.

WILL WE NEED TO ATTEND EVENTS TO SUPERVISE OUR STUDENTS?

You do not need to supervise young people on UniFest events. Full details of the safeguarding arrangements for UniFest are on our website.
